I am grateful for the opportunity to speak today in support of HCR 5020. I firmly believe we live in the greatest nation on earth and this very process continues to keep it that way. It is exciting for me, as an average citizen to take part in this.

A little background about me, I am your typical suburban mom. I have four kids. I spend a lot of time in the carpool lane. I am a PTA mom, a booster club mom, that list could go on and on. If there is a way to support my kids, I am there. Like everyone else in this room that is a parent, those kids are my life.

With that being said, I feel an immense amount of responsibility and duty to protect my children. One of the ways that I chose to stay prepared to defend myself and my children should the need ever arise, is by carrying a gun concealed. I am by no means a competitive shooter. I am just a mom who finds value in the second amendment. Before I made the decision to exercise my constitutional right, I went to great lengths to be a responsible gun owner.
