Subject: Bill Brief on SB 190

SB 190 requires a waiver of extradition proceedings as a condition of release prior to trial for any person charged with a felony.

Section 1 amends K.S.A. 22-2802, the statute in the Kansas code of criminal procedure relating to release prior to trial. The bill adds a new subsection to the statute to create an additional condition of release. For any person charged with a felony, the magistrate shall order such person to execute a waiver of extradition. The waiver shall: (1) State that such person consents to extradition to Kansas and waives all procedures related to extradition if the person is arrested in another state while on bond; and (2) acknowledge that such person shall not be released prior to trial in any other state pending extradition to Kansas.
