The cost of a private school is quite a financial burden, and some of our friends have chosen to homeschool because they just can't afford it, though they often complain that they wish private schools were cheaper. We feel this is an investment in our children's lives and give up other non-necessity spending to make sure the school bill is paid.

The teachers from private schools are paid below average salaries yet do so with a positive attitude because it's worth it to have true freedom of speech. It's worth it to have the freedom to teach truth in all subjects from science to history. It's worth it to be able to offer guidance and discipline (where needed) to help encourage and correct students to better prepare them for life situations they will surely come in contact with.

I urge you to pass this bill SB 128 to allow a tax credit for any student attending a private school to help relieve the burden of financial hardship so more children can have the option to attend.
