That financial margin will permit Kansas families to thrive, and the diversity of school choice will develop a stronger citizenry for the future of our state. This Senate Bill will provide tax relief, a very real support, to Kansas families who would wish to prepare their children through the school which they believe will provide the best structure of learning and support of values for their child's health and success in the future.
