## **Proponent Testimony for SB 49**

Thank you Chairman Olson and Committee Members for the opportunity to appear before you today in support of SB 49.

SB 49 would appear to me to be legislation that should have little to no opposition.

For Kansas residents who live in the footprint of a wind farm, the constant blinking red lights are a serious issue. For persons, like me, who do not live near or within sight of several acres of wind turbines, it may not seem like a problem. However, for home owners who live in close proximity to wind turbines, the blinking lights are a real issue. They disrupt sleep for people and animals. Additionally, I contend, that the constant blinking can/will cause headaches.
