| 10 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: |
| 11 | Section 1. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 32-988 is hereby amended to read as |
| 12 | follows: 32-988. (a) The secretary is authorized to adopt, in accordance |
| 13 | with K.S.A. 32-805, and amendments thereto, rules and regulations fixing |
| 14 | the amount of fees for the following items, subject to the following |
| 15 | limitations and subject to the requirement that no such rules and |
| 16 | regulations shall be adopted as temporary rules and regulations: |
| 17 | Big game permits |

| 19 | Nonresident (other than elk permit): maximum \$400 |
| 20 | Elk permit: maximum \$350 |
| 21 | Nonresident mule deer stamp: maximum \$150 |

| 23 | Combination hunting and fishing licenses |

(b) The fee for a landowner-tenant resident big game or wild turkey hunting permit shall be an amount equal to $^{1}/_{2}$ the fee for a general resident big game or wild turkey hunting permit.

Vendor bond: no maximum

- (c) The fee for a big game or wild turkey hunting permit for a resident under 16 years of age shall be an amount not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a general resident big game or wild turkey hunting permit.
- (d) The fee for a furharvester license for a resident under 16 years of age shall be an amount equal to $^{1}/_{2}$ the fee for a resident furharvester license.
- 30 (e) For a resident who is at least 65 years of age, but less than 75 years of age:
 - (1) The fee for an annual hunting license shall be an amount equal to $^{1}/_{2}$ the fee for a general annual hunting license;
 - (2) the fee for an annual fishing license shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a general annual fishing license; and
 - (3) the fee for an annual combination hunting and fishing license shall be an amount equal to $^{1}/_{2}$ the fee for a general annual combination hunting and fishing license.
- (f) Any person who is a resident of this state and satisfies the requirements to be considered a disabled veteran under K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 32-934, and amendments thereto, shall be exempt from the hunting and fishing license fees listed in subsection (a).
 - (g) The secretary may establish, by rules and regulations adopted in

accordance with K.S.A. 32-805, and amendments thereto, different fees for various classes and types of licenses, permits, stamps and other issuances of the department—which that may occur within each item as described under subsection (a).

- (h) A nonresident who enters the deer permit draw and does not obtain a—hunting white-tailed deer permit for the applicable hunting license year shall receive a—complete refund of the hunting license fee and any related fees that such nonresident paid pursuant to subsection (a), except that the department may retain an application fee of not to exceed \$30.
 - Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 32-988 is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
