## **HOUSE BILL No. 2686**

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AN ACT concerning health professions and practices; relating to prescribers; requiring prescribers to discuss risks and alternatives to certain addictive controlled substances with patients before prescribing such substances.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) A prescriber shall discuss with the patient, the patient's legal representative or, if the patient is under 18 years of age, the patient's parent or legal guardian, prior to issuing the initial prescription of a schedule II controlled substance listed in K.S.A. 65-4107, and amendments thereto, or any other opioid drug that is a prescription-only drug in a course of treatment for acute or chronic pain and again prior to issuing the third prescription of the course of treatment, the risks associated with drugs being prescribed, including but not limited to:

- (1) The risks of addiction and overdose associated with opioid drugs and the dangers of taking opioid drugs with alcohol, benzodiazepines and other central nervous system depressants;
  - (2) the reasons why the prescription is necessary;
  - (3) alternative treatments that may be available; and
- (4) risks associated with the use of the drugs being prescribed, specifically that opioids are highly addictive, even when taken as prescribed, there is a risk of developing a physical or psychological dependence on the controlled dangerous substance and the risks of taking more opioids than prescribed, or mixing sedatives, benzodiazepines or alcohol with opioids, can result in fatal respiratory depression.
- (b) The prescriber shall include a note in the patient's medical record that such prescriber has discussed with the patient, the patient's legal representative or the patient's parent or legal guardian, as applicable, the risks of developing a physical or psychological dependence on the controlled dangerous substance and alternative treatments that may be available.
  - (c) This section shall not apply to:
- (1) A prescription for a patient who is currently in active treatment for cancer, receiving hospice care from a licensed hospice or palliative care or is a resident of an adult care home; or
  - (2) to any medications that are being prescribed for use in the

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1 treatment of substance abuse or opioid dependence.

(d) As used in this section:

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- (1) "Adult care home" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 39-923, and amendments thereto; and
- (2) "prescriber" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 65-1626, and amendments thereto; and
- (3) "prescription-only drug" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 65-1626, and amendments thereto.
