AN ACT concerning the federal 340B drug pricing program; imposing restrictions concerning the federal 340B drug pricing program; enacting the defense of affordable prescriptions act to prohibit manufacturer interference relating to a 340B drug.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the defense of affordable prescriptions act.

- (b) As used in this section:
- (1) "340B-covered entity" means an entity that is participating in the federal 340B drug pricing program authorized by 42 U.S.C. § 256b, including such entity's pharmacy or pharmacies, or any pharmacy or pharmacies contracted for the purpose of dispensing drugs purchased through such program;
- (2) "340B drug" means a drug that has been subject to any offer for reduced prices by a manufacturer pursuant to the federal 340B drug pricing program authorized by 42 U.S.C. § 256b and is purchased by a covered entity;
- (3) "manufacturer" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 65-1626, and amendments thereto; and
- (4) "pharmacy" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 65-1626, and amendments thereto.
 - (c) A manufacturer shall not:
- (1) Deny, restrict, prohibit or otherwise interfere with the acquisition of a 340B drug by or delivery of a 340B drug to a pharmacy that is under contract with a 340B-covered entity and authorized under such contract to receive and dispense 340B drugs on behalf of the 340B-covered entity, unless such receipt and dispensing of 340B drugs by such pharmacy is prohibited by the United States department of health and human services; or
- (2) interfere with a pharmacy that has a contract with a 340B-covered entity.
- (d) Any violation of this act shall be a violation of the Kansas consumer protection act and shall be subject to any and all of the enforcement provisions of the Kansas consumer protection act.
 - (e) Nothing in this act shall be construed to:

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- (1) Be less restrictive than federal law for a person or entity regulated 1 2 by this act; 3
- (2) conflict with applicable federal law or regulation; or
 (3) conflict with limited distribution of a drug required under 21 4 U.S.C. § 355-1. 5
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book. 6 7
