RE: Current Election Bills in Work

Dear Representative Bergquist,

OVERVIEW

The 2020 election has become a national issue of election integrity wherein large amounts of irregularities that should not have occurred were documented, many of those becoming outright violations of election laws; yet a consorted effort has been made to paint our national and state election systems and processes as being perfectly secure. They are anything but. And this is being proven by major investigations in key battleground states on a continuing basis.

The question is to what extent, if any, vulnerabilities exist and violations have occurred in Kansas. Our state officials profess there are no major problems in our state but fail to provide the same hard evidence that would be required to prove election fraud. The report accompanying this letter suggests that there are far too many well-documented types and cases of election integrity issues to merely accept hearsay on election security as “evidence.” If there are no problems, then why are so many people so adamant about denying serious, thorough forensic investigations to prove it? What are they afraid of? Or what are they hiding? Such resistance only supports growing suspicion there are problems that may disenfranchise every Kansas voter.

DISCUSSION

Our Vote: The right to vote is the most important treasure we citizens have. It determines who we elect to represent us. Those elected officials control much of our lives with the rules, regulations and laws they create. If a maleficent faction controls our votes, then ultimately they will control us. Thus, it is incumbent upon our legislators to do everything possible to ensure there are absolutely no vulnerabilities in nor exploitation of our election process.

National Plague of Election Malfeasance: The accompanying report is only a fraction of the evidence so far discovered that prove there are coordinated efforts to manipulate our elections. Our team, the Liberty Lions, has been assembling these reports and analyses for 18 months and has been working with national figures to confirm one fact: Our elections ARE NOT secure. The question is whether Kansas is afflicted with any of these measures and, if so, to what extent. The same declarations of secure elections heard from our officials are the same heard in other states that are proving to be false. The same officials and parties who would benefit from the election misconduct discovered elsewhere are the same who profess there are no election problems there.

And in many cases, they go to the extent of obstructing efforts (such as audits) and even intimidating, threatening or suing those who dare challenge their claims.

Sample of Evidence: We have volumes of reports citing analyses, affidavits, reports and studies that disprove claims of election security. And we have serious concerns that need to be addressed about Kansas election security. The accompanying report barely touches on them. Nevertheless, the following are just some prominent examples discovered in the 2020 election of why our recommendations should be accepted:

- A Navarro study documented 36 methods that were used to manipulate votes.
- Registration rolls were intentionally inflated and used for illegal ballots; one example of proof is 134 counties in 8 states with more voters than registered voters.
- Voting machines were found to be connected to the Internet, and capable of flipping votes and rejecting a high percentage of votes allowing for fraudulent adjudication;
- Ballot harvesting, mail-in ballots, and chain-of-custody failures provided many opportunities for massive amounts of fraudulent ballots and/or votes to be added.

Three Major Sources of Election Fraud: While there are three dozen methods currently identified as ways election outcomes were illegally manipulated in 2020, there are three principal sources where the majority of votes are affected. And all three can and must be addressed now to prevent an unsecure 2022 election. They are: 1) Registration violations; 2) Electronic voting machines; and 3) Intentional malfeasance by election personnel failing to follow procedures and laws.

Grassroots Efforts: Legislators are busy; and they do not have time to become experts much less spend time researching issues in the election process. Thus, individuals and groups like ours have done deep dives to determine for ourselves if there are problems. The trouble is we are often thwarted in obtaining requested information that should be available to the public. Why?

Supporting Evidence: The accompanying report is one of various efforts produced to provide you basic information on identified problems found in other states that *may* exist in Kansas. The report identifies factual studies, analyses and conclusions that confirm we have an unsecure national election system, one intentionally protected with disinformation by those who undoubtedly benefit from it. It is a tutorial from which one conclusion must be drawn:

Based upon findings in other states, Kansas cannot be assured we have a secure election system unless and until there is a top-down, inside-out study and forensic audit of all aspects of our election system, particularly our voting machines and election network.

RECOMMENDATIONS

There is already a grassroots' loss of confidence in the integrity of our elections despite official hand-waving to the contrary. And there is massive evidence from major investigations nationwide that 2020 was anything but a secure election. To believe Kansas is immune from the various methods used to manipulate votes in 2020 is naïve at best. To assume declarations of election integrity from officials are correct when no in-depth analyses have been performed to prove such proclamations is wishful thinking. If our election system is so profoundly secure, why are there so many who are afraid of proving this by serious investigation? And why are they so

opposed to providing evidence requested by grassroots investigators? We have no malicious agenda. Our only goal is to ensure our vote counts and illegal votes do not.


There are trillions of dollars controlled by those who win elections. Thus, there are trillions of reasons why bad actors would be interested in winning elections by any means possible, and others would be willing to dishonestly protect them with disinformation.

For the last year, that disinformation campaign has been extensive and levied against anyone who questions election integrity, even to the point of being accompanied by intimidation and threats. Clearly, something is amiss in our national elections if certain people and officials are so afraid of audits, investigations and analyses of election data, equipment, systems and processes.

We must not assume that Kansas is insulated from malice. Because of the potential that our election system may not be as secure as alleged and that our most sacred right is at stake, we recommend the following be taken by our legislature.

- 1) Create an Elections Integrity Commission to investigate the entire Kansas election system and make recommendations for all necessary changes to absolutely secure our elections;
- 2) Authorize a full forensic audit of the Kansas voting system, its voting equipment, and the 2020 election results;
- 3) Authorize the capture of forensic images from voting machines and prohibition of any updates to election machines until such data is captured;
- 4) Take measures to secure all data in all state election machines and all communications regarding the 2020 election until after audits are completed.
