
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2619 by House Committee on Financial Institutions and Rural Development

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2619 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2619 would require that on or before January 15, 2023, and each January 15 after that, each city and county would post on its official website an annual one-page summary of the compensation package of each elected city or county officer for that particular city or county. If an elected city or county officer receives compensation from more than one position in the city or county, the city or county would post the specific compensation for each position in addition to the total compensation for all positions for the elected city or county officer.

The League of Kansas Municipalities states the bill's enactment would have a negligible fiscal effect on cities with websites; however, cities without websites would have to pay for the creation of a website. The Kansas Association of Counties states enactment of the bill could increase administrative costs for procedural development on how to collect and publish the compensation information specified in the bill.
