**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2654 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2654 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2654 would provide guidance for the consolidation of supervision of offenders that are under the supervision of both the Department of Corrections and Office of Judicial Administration. The bill would allow the Office of Judicial Administration and the Department of Corrections to enter into a memorandum of understanding related to the supervision of such offenders.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of the bill could have a fiscal effect because it could affect the number of cases supervised by court services officers. The bill could also affect supervision fees received by the courts. However, a fiscal effect cannot be determined because any potential increase or decrease in cases cannot be estimated.

The Sentencing Commission and the Department of Corrections indicates enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2654 is not reflected in *The FY 2023 Governor's Budget Report*.
