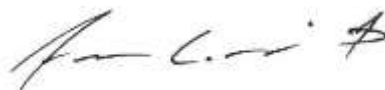
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2692 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2692 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2692 would increase membership of the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training from 12 to 15. The bill would increase the one member representing the public at large to four members who represent the public. These members could not be associated with law enforcement with preference given to people of color to ensure diverse, ethnic representation and who are from high-need, underserved communities with disproportionately high instances of interaction with law enforcement and high rates of gun violence, unemployment, child poverty, and commitments to the Department of Corrections. These members would be selected by the Kansas State Conference of NAACP Branches, and one of these members would serve as the Chairperson.

Enactment of HB 2692 would have no fiscal effect.
