**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2644**

As Amended by Senate Committee on Federal  
and State Affairs

**Brief\***

HB 2644, as amended, would designate the Sandhill plum, also known as the Chickasaw plum, as the official state fruit.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

**Background**

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Federal and State Affairs at the request of Representative Garber.

***House Committee on Federal and State Affairs***

In the House Committee hearing, **proponent** testimony was provided by a Healy Elementary School student, six Sabetha Elementary School students, and three Valley Falls Elementary School students. The proponents described the multiple-school effort to learn about the political process and select a proposed state fruit. The proponents indicated that 30 other states have designated a state fruit, but Kansas has not. The proponents further described the Sandhill plum as a fruit native to Kansas that is versatile and resilient.

No other testimony was provided.

### ***Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs***

The Senate Committee amended the bill to change its effective date to upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

### **Fiscal Information**

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill as introduced, the Office of the Secretary of State indicates enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect.
